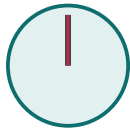

Answer Key

Q1: (A) (a) 12 midnight.

Q2: (C) (c) 00 to 23.

Q3: (C) (c) 3:00 pm. $15 - 12 = 3$, and it's pm.

Q4: (B) (b) 12 noon.

Q5: (A) (a) am/pm — since every hour has a unique number, no label is needed.

Q6: (D) (d) 9:30 am. Below 12, so it stays the same and is am.

Q7: (A) (a) 16:00. $4 + 12 = 16$, since it's pm.

Q8: (B) (b) 07:00. Am hours stay the same, just written with two digits.

Q9: (D) (d) 8:00 pm. $20 - 12 = 8$, and it's pm.

Q10: (B) (b) 11:00. Am hours below 12 stay the same.

Q11: (A) (a) 6:45 pm. $18 - 12 = 6$, and it's pm.

Q12: (B) (b) 12 hours. 21:00 is 9:00 pm; from 9 am to 9 pm is 12 hours.

Q13: (B) (b) 1:40 pm. $13 - 12 = 1$, and it's pm.

Q14: (C) (c) 9:15 pm. $21 - 12 = 9$, and it's pm.

Q15: (C) (c) 05:30 — it's already 12 or below, so no subtraction is needed.

Q16: (D) (d) 23:45. $11 + 12 = 23$, since it's pm.

Q17: (A) (a) 10:30 pm. $22 - 12 = 10$, and it's pm.

Q18: (A) (a) 00:30. Just after midnight, 12:xx am becomes 00:xx in 24-hour time.

Q19: (D) (d) 08:15. $06:15 + 2 \text{ hours} = 08:15$.

Q20: (B) (b) 12:30. 12 pm times stay as 12:xx in 24-hour time, since 12 noon is the special case.

Q21: (A) (a) 00:10. $23:50 + 20 \text{ minutes}$ crosses midnight to 00:10 the next day.

Q22: (D) (d) Yes — 24:00 is sometimes used to mean the very end of a day, the same instant as 00:00 the next day.

Q23: (B) (b) 12 hours. From 8 am to 8 pm is 12 hours.

Q24: (A) (a) 16:50. $14:20 + 2\text{h}30\text{m} = 16:50$.

Q25: (B) (b) 24-hour clock — since 22 is above 12, it must be 24-hour notation, meaning 10 am to 10 pm.

Q26: (C) (c) 45 minutes. From 19:30 to 20:15 is 45 minutes.

Q27: (D) (d) 8 hours 30 minutes. From 09:15 to 17:15 is 8 hours, plus 30 more minutes to 17:45.

Q28: (C) (c) Reading '18:45' as just '6:45' without noticing it's a 24-hour number above 12 wrongly leaves open whether it's am or pm — but since 18 is above 12, it can ONLY be pm.

Q29: (B) (b) 5 minutes after midnight — 00:00 is midnight, so 00:05 is just after it.

Q30: (A) (a) 19:00 and 7:00 pm — $19 - 12 = 7$, and it's pm.
